Dear Mr. President,

We the People of the Republic of Poland, representatives of the global community, committed to improving our civilization, “to establish Justice, ensure domestic Tranquility, provide for the common defense, promote the general Welfare, and secure the Blessings of Liberty to ourselves and our Posterity”, confronted with many ominous warning signs of critical threats to the world, stand firmly alongside you today, in defense of natural law, the U.S. Constitution and the values it protects.

There have been many grave warning signs in recent years. The most recent one being the Pandemic – a huge disinformation and social engineering campaign, meticulously planned, organized and implemented by our common adversaries. The sobering letter of Archbishop Carlo Maria Viganò’s of June 7th 2020, addressed to you, was further confirmation of the seriousness of the situation we find ourselves in. No further warnings are necessary.

We write to you from Poland, in solidarity and in support of you, Mr. President, and the American people. American freedom and the victory of truth in the United States are of the utmost importance to the world. We must not allow the mainstream media to win this war. They certainly cannot for they have fallen into the hands of ignoble proprietors. The media lie not because they wish to, but because that is what their proprietors desire. There is a dramatic imbalance in access to citizens’ minds and awareness, representing a great threat to American freedom and more widely to the world’s freedom. Under these circumstances, we stand firmly on the side of truth!

“To deserve the blessing and gratitude, not only for the current generation but also for future generations; for the sake of the public good and to secure our liberty...” (Polish Constitution of May 3rd 1791), we are ready to fight. Similarly to our fathers, the founders of the Second Republic of Poland we hope “...for the good of the whole of renascent humanity” (Polish Constitution of March 17th 1921).

The measure of our credibility, as defenders of the civilization of good and truth, must be the defense of the weakest and defenseless among us. We therefore refer to your presidential campaigns, and your efforts to end human trafficking. The international trade in children and human organs undermines the age-old world order. Crimes against the young cannot be forgotten and must not go unpunished. Regardless of how powerful and determined the perpetrators are, let us pursue them together, in solidarity, denounce, judge and pass a just sentence on the guilty.

It is by no means a coincidence that we make references to the world’s first two historically most important constitutions, namely the U.S. Constitution of 1787 and the Polish Constitution of 1791. This present moment in history is no less important. The cause of solidarity lies at the foundation of the struggle for liberty that Poles have led for centuries. We must continue the fight for liberty. In this common cause, we would be grateful for your engagement and close co-operation.

That is why – “In the name of God, one in the Holy Trinity (...) free from the disgraceful shackles of foreign influence, prizing more than life and personal happiness, the political existence, liberty and independence from external influences” (Polish Constitution of May 3rd 1791) – we stand with you, at your side, Mr. President.
